- Embed the whole school writing approach to ensure 50% of students achieve in the Upper 2 Bands in NAPLAN writing in Years 3 and 5; 90% of students achieve an A-C in English; and 100% of students have writing goals based on a writing data set.
- Facilitate professional learning for Teachers and Teacher Aides in writing so that 90% of students receive a "C" or better in English.
- Implementation of the *Australian Curriculum: Technologies*.


